SWEET SURRENDER, AMAZING GRACE

A message from our Ministerial Team

In John Denver's song, "Sweet Surrender" are these lines: I don't know what the future is holdin' in store I don't know where I'm goin' I'm not sure where I've been There's a spirit that guides me, a light that shines for me My life is worth the livin', I don't need to see the end

A similar idea is expressed in the hymn, "Amazing Grace":

Through many dangers, toils, and snares I have already come 'Tis grace that brought me safe thus far And grace will lead me home

The concept that a "spirit guides us" and that "grace will lead us home" is expressed in this Unity principle: *There is one Presence and Power in the universe and in our lives*. But Unity is not a place that insists everyone should believe the same thing. We don't ask you to accept as fact whatever is read in scripture or heard from our sanctuary platform. In many ways, we are engaged in something very different from traditional church.

The main point of any Unity lesson is not to believe it; it's to examine it, try it out in the laboratory of daily experience, and see if it has a positive effect. Principles that are merely believed but not tested and experienced have little transforming power. Throughout April, we will be testing these related concepts:

- That stress and conflict is often the result of our inner and outer reactions to life;
- That if we view a person or situation as our enemy, our thoughts reflect back to us;
- That if we look for the good and the lessons for growth in each challenge, this positive, peaceful viewpoint will reflect back to us;
- That one of the most powerful ways we can focus on the good is to trust the flow of life:
- That the more we surrender to this benevolent flow or "divine grace," the more apparent that grace will become.

Perhaps because music seems to touch the deepest part of our being, mystics often speak of our unfolding universe in musical terms. Is it possible we can live in closer harmony with the universal song not by resisting its most surprising and jarring notes, but by learning to sing along? Message from our Board of Trustee's Treasurer Vicky Hills

I have been a member of our Board of Trustees since February 2018. I became Treasurer late in 2019, when Tim Harrow stepped down. This position is challenging to say the least, and I wear out my calculator crunching numbers to make ends meet and pay for our ongoing monthly expenses like utilities, office supplies, building maintenance, and payroll while remaining focused on our source and purpose:



To celebrate and express the light and love of God in each other and all things.

Like us, most churches and community centers had to close during the Covid pandemic, and many will never be able to regain the financial support to reopen. Unity of the Valley was unique in our approach to the serious challenges the pandemic brought us, in that we never stopped serving our congregation. Even though closed, we continued to work hard behind the scenes to provide services to you and establish other avenues in which we could stay connected. During that time your Simple Giving kept flowing to keep us alive as we all envisioned the time of our reopening. Due to your loving financial support, we are open today and continue to thrive and prosper! We are also now able to begin opening our doors to paying outside events.

Every year, we create a budget base that includes not only expenses, but also how much income we hope to receive to cover those expenses. Due to inflation, this year, 2023, we increased our budget to include modest wage increases for our three employees. This means we need to receive more income to cover everything... about \$1,700 per month as our normal monthly expenses total more than \$17,000.

To help cover these increases we are investing in safe US Treasury T-Bills. We are also asking you to help keep our loving community financially sound by increasing your Simple Giving Plan, if possible. If you are not a member of this plan, now would be a great time to join!
