SERVICES IN AUGUST

Donated items should be shelf-stable food (i.e., canned or no refrigeration needed)

Some suggested donation items are:

- Protein such as peanut butter, canned meat: tuna, chicken, salmon, corned beef, etc.
- Dried beans.
- Canned food, soup, spices, cooking oil, broths.
- Shelf-stable non-dairy milk alternative (i.e., almond milk, oat milk, soy milk, etc.).
- Cereal, grains, pasta, rice.
- Baby food, baby formula.

A Note from Board President, Dr. Serenee Smith

UNITY OF THE VALLEY'S MUSICAL STORY

I recently had the opportunity to attend some of the extraordinary concerts presented at the Oregon Bach Festival. Among my favorite pieces were those born out of the composer's day-to-day personal experiences living though extreme hardship. In the depths of their suffering they chose to tell the story of their survival through music and out of this has come some of the most moving compositions ever written.



One composer living in New York, right beside the hospital that became ground zero when Covid 19 first broke out, was told by his doctor that due to his asthma his chances of surviving the virus were slim. So, he set out to chronical the progression of the pandemic in music as he isolated himself in his apartment for over two years. Another composer, an Auschwitz survivor wrote a piece for the clarinet, violin, and piano into which he poured out his feeling about what he believed to be the last days of his life in a concentration camp.

Listening to these musical stories made me think about the composition Unity of the Valley has created detailing the challenges these last couple of years have presented. We've certainly had our own front row seat as we've navigated our ministry through the ups and downs of the tedious Covid 19 pandemic.

I think that Unity's Musical Story would begin with the sweet overtones of faith provided by the Ministerial Team and the unified vision with which they conducted our ministry. Unity's Board of Trustee's provided the rhythm and steady beat of discipline establishing the valuable polices that would provide the theme for our composition. The Shared Leadership Team with their many diverse tones and voices led with their strong melodies keeping us in tune and on track. Our supporting ministry teams including, prayer, music, youth education, and angel network added their holy harmonies to our growing composition. And our blessed congregation kept us up to date on how many beats we needed to measure the needs of our flock as we carefully made our way.



- 1. Your name, mailing address, phone number, and email address.
- 2. Your association with Unity of the Valley.
- 3. Name of a reference at Unity of the Valley (someone who knows you).
- 4. Brief description of your financial need.
- 5. How much you are requesting.
- 6. Do you think your financial needs will require monthly support?

Requests for monetary help will be reviewed by our Ministerial Team. If a request is approved, the amount granted will be dependent on how many requests we receive and how much money is available in the OSCSF.
