that the greatest barrier in our quest for fulfillment is simply *not knowing the one thing we think we know best: OURSELVES?* 



Most of us can recognize some gaps in our self-understanding. Upon getting our third parking ticket in a month, we may grumble, "Why do I keep doing that?" Or if we reach beyond our comfort zone by leading a successful volunteer project, we may be pleasantly surprised by our newly-tapped abilities.

Yet, within most human minds is a kind of operating system–or OS– similar to what runs our computers. Our OS is based on beliefs, attitudes, and habits largely formed in the dim past, so it rarely gets updated without intentional intervention. It kicks into gear as soon we wake in the morning, guiding how we view every situation, how we feel about it, and what we're going to do about it. It generates our assumptions about what we are capable of, how worthy we are of abundance, whether or not we can quickly forgive others and ourselves, how enthusiastic we are about our future, and on and on.

In other words, the average person's self-identity is more a reflection of programing or conditioning than of essential reality.

Uncovering our essential reality is at the core of the great spiritual teachings through the ages. Why? Probably because this is the key to shining our brightest light in the world. Also, there are few subjects more shrouded in mystery and misunderstanding than what we are behind our temporary physical appearance.

This month, we will identity a new and higher vision of ourselves through an ancient ceremony (week 1). We will carefully discern how our spiritual essence differs from our ego (weeks 2 and 3). Finally, we will hear from a guest presenter who exemplifies the higher consciousness we all wish to see serving in our federal government.




